The WWDM Brenda Jones Memorial Scholarship is a non-renewable one-time award, sent directly to the college or university where its recipient attends school.

Criteria

This \$\frac{\$5000}{2}\$ scholarship is awarded each year to a graduating African-American high school senior who resides in Richland, Lexington, Newberry, Fairfield, or Sumter counties.

Applicants must:

- ✓ Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 to be eligible.
- ✓ Be accepted by an accredited college or university at the time of the scholarship award.
- ✓ Meet financial need requirements.

Applicants must submit the following: (Application will be marked incomplete if any of the below is missing)

- ✓ An official high school transcript
- ✓ A copy of SAT and/or ACT scores
- ✓ Documentation of involvement in community activities and service projects
- ✓ 250-word essay demonstrating financial need
- ✓ Recent photograph
- ✓ Copy of college or university acceptance letter
- ✓ Two letters of recommendation
- ✓ 500-word essay

WWDM Brenda Jones Memorial Scholarship HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Scholarship Background

The WWDM Brenda Jones Memorial Scholarship was started in 1994 because of the philanthropic efforts of business executive John Marshall and his family. Marshall was a Columbia Urban League board member and, for more than 20 years, owned WWDM, a.k.a. The Big DM – the state's top-rated radio station. When the Marshalls sold the radio station in 1994, John Marshall donated \$100,000 to the Columbia Urban League to endow a scholarship for deserving high school seniors. Over the next several years, Mr. Marshall increased his donation, bringing the total scholarship contribution to \$125,000. The Columbia Urban League awards a scholarship through the Brenda Jones Memorial Scholarship Fund each year.

How the Scholarship Got Its Name

In 1996, after veteran news anchor Brenda Jones passed away, WWDM renamed the scholarship the WWDM Brenda Jones Memorial Scholarship. Mr. Marshall felt this was a fitting tribute because Brenda Jones was a highly respected journalist known for her commitment to achievement. Before her death, she enjoyed a stellar career and had a reputation for going the extra mile to achieve excellence.
